Profile of the College

Founded in 1970 by a great educationist and philanthropist late Smt. Om Prabha Jain, the then Finance Minister, Haryana, Indira Gandhi Mahila Mahavidyalaya has emerged today as a premier institution, par excellence for higher education for girls. In early seventies, people in this area were reluctant to send their girls to a co-educational institute for higher education due to their conservative attitude & traditional biasness. The need for establishing a women's college for imparting value based education was felt. In this noble & herculean task Late Om Prabha Jain was supported by the men of great vision & worthy members of Bal Shiksha Samiti- Mahashai Brij Lal, Sh. Ram Gopal Latka, Sh. Bhagwan Das & Sh. Mohan Bahadur Khurania (Advocate). Many renowned personalities of the time like Seth Niranjana Dass Badhwar, Seth Durga Prasad Gupta, Seth Kulwant Rai & Lala Janki Das Singhal opened their treasuries to contribute in this benevolent task. The then Chief Minister, Ch. Bansi Lal laid the foundation stone on 10th April, 1970.

The first session of the college was started during the construction stage of the building. Initially it was affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh. Pre-university and B.A-1 and part-II were immediately opened and highly qualified staff was appointed. On 19th November 1971, the college was dedicated to Smt. Indira Gandhi, the Prime Minister of India. The dedication ceremony was performed by Sh. Hemvati Nandan Bahuguna, the then Union Minister. A historic dance ballet, "Amarpali", was successfully staged by our college students and Govt. College students, Chandigarh, under the direction of a world famous dancer, Shobha Kosar. Ramayana was also staged in the same year by the artist of Bhartiya Kala Kendra and Hon'ble, Minister of Revenue, Pt. Chiranji Lal Sharma was the chief guest. For the first time the College Day was celebrated in 1973 which was synchronized with the birthday of our Prime Minister, Smt. Indira Gandhi and the Union Minister for Tourism and Civil Aviation, Dr. Sarojini Mahishi, presided over the function. Since then the college is celebrating the College Day on 19th Nov. every year.

After the progressive span of forty six years now college possesses a group of well equipped buildings: Administrative Block with software networking, Computerized Library, Smt. Om Prabha Jain Commercial Art Block, Lala Amar Nath Khurania Commerce and P.G. Block, Multipurpose Block, Sports Room, NCC Room, N.S.S. Room, Auditorium, Play Grounds, O.P Jindal Memorial Gym, Dr. Shanno Devi Seminar Hall, Rajiv Arora Memorial Fitness Hall, Functional English Lab, three A.C. Computer Labs with Internet facility, Four A.C. Staff Rooms, Reading Room etc. By the unflinching efforts of our management a new Pt. Chiranji Lal Sharma Science Block has been added in the infrastructure of the college in July 2014. The foundation stone of the Science Block was laid by Sh. Shamsher Singh Surjewala, Chairman, All India Kisan Khet Mazdoor Congress on 1st Sep 2012. Fully equipped Medical / Non-Medical Science Labs are also provided to complete the requirement. A new well furnished canteen with modernized facilities with the capacity of 200 seats was also constructed in the session: 2013-14. Tara Mateshwari Library of the college has been renovated & given a new look in the session 2015-16. A three storeyed building has been constructed to fulfill the requirement of the growing strength of the students.

Today, the college aims at achieving the quality and excellence in academic performance. Special emphasis is given on the all- round development of the students. Now about 3000 girls are on roll. Looking at the changing scenario and demand, various new courses and subjects have been introduced with the sincere efforts of our benevolent Management and dedicated Principal. Mathematics, Psychology and Geography have been introduced at U.G Level. Simultaneously our college got the P.G. status by opening regular M.A. in English and Economics, M.Com., M.Sc. Maths and P.G.D.C.A. The beginning of B.Sc. Medical/ Non-Medical/ Computer Science has proved a boon for the girls of the town and nearby villages. In the relaxed and secured atmosphere girls move freely and learn a lot. Top positions in University merit lists are the proofs that the Management, Principal and Staffs have left no stone unturned in realizing the dreams of the founder, Late Smt. Om Prabha Jain.

Our Governing Body is working very efficiently for the welfare of the college under the able guidance of our unopposed president Sh. Surjeet Bahadur Khurania since 2002. The day since Sh. Jagdish Bahadur Khurania has been taken the charge of Mahila Mahavidyalaya Samiti, as an elected president of Samiti, the college has been adding new dimensions of achievement and progress. From the time of Smt. Om Prabha Jain, Sh. Mohan Bahadur Khurania (Advocate), has been a source of inspiration and guidance for the Management, Staff and students. The college has pursued its journey towards excellence under the leadership of President of Governing Body Sh. Surjit Bahadur Khurania and Vice President of Governing Body Sh. Ram Bahadur Khurania. Our enthusiastic, Vice President Sh. Ram Bahadur Khurania has been working tirelessly for the progress of the college and for his unflinching dedication he has been honored by Sh. Randeep Singh Surjewala, Chairman, Communication Cell, All India Congress Committee. Dr. Sadhana Thukral who took the charge of principalship in 2007, is working hard for the progress of the college. Recently she has been honoured by Ch. Dharamveer Singh (C.P.S.) for her excellent works & good results at district level on Republic Day, 2014 and she has also been honoured by Smt. Savitri Jindal (Minister of Haryana) w/o Late Shri O.P. Jindal in 2014 on the occasion of Sewa Shakti March Rally. She has also been honoured by Lions club, Bhartiya Vikas Parishad and IMA from time to time.

Many dignitaries have visited and appreciated the efforts of our benevolent Management in the field of education. Israel diplomat: Epharm Duke, Chinese diplomat: Jiang-Weimimg, 1st lady Prime Minister: Smt. Indira Gandhi, a great dancer of International fame, Yamini Krishnamurti, Union Minister for Tourism and Civil Aviation, Dr. Sarojini Mahishi, Sh. O.P. Jindal, Sh. Bhajan Lal, Sh. Khurshid Ahmed Khan, Sh. Lachman Dass Arora, Judges from High Court, I.A.S. Officers. Eminent politicians like Sh. Shamsher Singh Surjewala, Sh. Randeep Singh Surjewala, Sh. Kuldeep Sharma, Naveen Jindal (M.P.) and many other famous personalities Dr. Mahaveer Singh (Commissioner, Ambala Division), Sh. Anurag Aggarwal, I.A.S. (Home Secretary, Chandigarh), Sh. For the last five years 20-25 students of our college have been attaining positions in the top ten of K.U.K. every year. - 6 Students have to keep their identity card during college hours in the college campus.

- 8 Ragging is banned. Strict legal action will be taken against the defaulters as per the orders of administration.
- 9 As per the order of Deputy Commissioner, Kaithal, it is necessary for every student to make their voter card. The students who are above the age of 18 years at the time of admission but do not possess voter card, have to fill the Form no. 6 in the prospectus and submit it to the college librarian along with two passport size photographs, Photocopy of Birth Certificate/Matriculation, Ration Card and Identity Proof or voter Card of any member of their family.
10. As per D.H.E. rule ADHAR CARD is must for receiving any type of scholarship and concession.
11. Additional Fee will be charged for the subjects which are under self-financing scheme.

General Instructions for Admission

1. Admission to B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Ist Semester will be strictly on merit basis as per KUK/State Govt. Instructions.
2. Application for Admission received after 30th June, 2016 would not be considered. Lists (1st, 2nd and 3rd) will be displayed on notice board on the dates given in the schedule of admission.
3. If the last date for admission falls on a holiday or is declared a holiday by the Kurukshetra University, the next working day will be considered as the last date for admission.
4. Permission for joining late shall not be accepted as a justification for condoning deficiency in lectures. If a candidate is allowed for late admission as a result of any change in the rules/admissions policy made by the University, the lectures shall be counted from the date of admission or from the eleventh day of the date on which the decision to change the rules of admission policy was taken whichever is earlier.
5. Mathematics will be given to only those students who have taken Mathematics in lower qualifying exam.
6. The Principal of the college will make provisional admission of their own students in promotional classes of B.A./B.Com./B.Sc./BCA/BMC II & III, MA/M.Com./M.Sc. (Final). On declaration of the result, if a student fails, her provisional admission shall stand cancelled as initio. No student from outside/Other colleges/Departments may be granted admission to promotional classes of. B.A./ B.Com./ B.Sc./BCA/BMC II and III & M.A./M.Com./M.Sc. (Final)
7. Migration from other colleges is not allowed.
8. Admission may also be denied to such candidates who in the past were found to be indulging in any activity leading to indiscipline in the college.
9. As per State Govt./University instructions the study of a subject will be closed if the number of students in the subject is less than twenty.
10. If a student remains absent from the class for 14 days or more in a month, her name will be struck off from the college rolls and her parents will be informed.
11. Certificate of reserved category must be submitted with admission form.
12. Candidate having compartment/re-appear in U.G. Class shall not be allowed admission in P.G. courses.

13. The principal will have the right to change any of the rules as per the guidelines and instructions received from K.U.K/State Govt. from time to time without any prior notice.
14. All such students who have passed their lower qualifying examination from other Board/University in India (except Board of School Education, Haryana & Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra) are required to submit their original migration certificate at the time of admission.
Note : A student will not be promoted to 5th semester of any course unless she has passed all the papers of 1st semester of their course.

Rules for Internal Assessment

2. In the P.G. courses also there is a provision of internal assessment as 20% marks will be earmarked for the internal assessment which will be awarded on the above based criteria w.e.f. 2011-12.

Eligibility Conditions for Appearing in University Examination

- (i) Minimum 75% attendance in the classes.
- (ii) 20% marks in class tests and assignments.

Note: Roll Number can be detained if they do not fulfil the university conditions.

Rules Regarding Bus Passes

1. Bus pass will be issued from Kaithal to that place of the student which she has filled in the admission form as her place of residence.
2. A student shall be responsible for any tempering, such as, change in photo, signatures or irregularity of any sort.
3. Students shall contact College Office regarding issue of Bus Passes or their renewal.
4. Students should deposit fees for the renewal of Bus Pass at least one week prior to the validity period of the old bus pass.
5. Bus passes are issued only for the duration of studies/examinations and not for the period of summer vacation. Pass holders should deposit their bus-passes in college office as soon as the academic session is over.
6. Pass-Holders should keep their re-issued passes with the special permission of the Principal only if a copy of F.I.R. lodged with Police and Rs.50/- for duplicate bus-pass fee and the requisite bus fare is deposited by the student in the college office.

Rules Regarding Cycle/Scooter Stand

1. Only those students who deposit cycle/scooter parking fee shall be allowed to park their vehicles at the proper places in the college campus.
2. Students are advised in their own interest to get their vehicles insured.
3. Students should properly lock their vehicles. College shall not be responsible for the unlocked or improperly locked vehicles.
4. Students should park their vehicles in the parking stand only. A student shall be punished if her vehicle is found placed anywhere else in the college.

Rules for Library

Scholarships Sponsored Govt.

A number of scholarships/stipends are available under the following schemes. The eligible students should submit their applications on prescribed forms complete in all respect to the Principal by 31-08-2016 positively.

1. Govt. of India Post Matric Scholarship Scheme for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes students. Under this scheme those Schedule Caste/Scheduled Tribes students, the total income of whose parents from all sources, does not exceed Rs. 1,00,000 per annum, are eligible for the scholarship. All children of the same parents can avail the benefit under the scheme. There is however no limit to the number of girls scholarship. The Heads of Institutions are competent to sanction those scholarship.
2. State Harijan Welfare Scheme for backward class students : The students belonging to recognised backward classes whose parents' income is Rs. 1,00,000/- per annum are eligible for stipends under this scheme.
3. Govt. of India National Scheme of Post Matric Scholarship to lower in-come group notified Nomadic and Semi-Nomadic students. A limited number of scholarships are available under the scheme for award to the eligible students in general category on the basis of total annual income of their parents.
4. Govt. of India National Loan Scholarship Scheme. :- The students who are eligible for the scholarship under any other scheme can seek loan under this scheme provided they secure at least 50% marks in the qualifying examination. The annual basic pay of their parents should however not exceed Rs. 6000/- (after deduction relatable items allowed under the Income Tax Laws). There is however no income limit in respect of post graduate classes. The condition of 50% marks or that of income is however, not applicable in renewal cases.
5. (i) Govt. of India National Scholarship Scheme.
(ii) Govt. of India National Merit Scholarship Scheme for the children of school teachers.
(iii) Haryana State Govt. (Edu. Deptt.) Merit Scholarship for general University Edu. awarded Scholarship each year. The eligible students are asked by the examination bodies to fill up the application forms and the scholarships are sanctioned by the Director General of Higher Education, Haryana strictly on the basis of Merit Scholarship. The students have to submit their application form to the Director General of Higher Education (DHE), Haryana, through the Heads of their institutions.

University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau

In collaboration with Department of Employment, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra is running the bureau to assist the students in choosing of career courses in the university campus.

The main function of the bureau is :-

1. To provide information and guidance in educational & vocational matters.
2. To register graduates (Professional Specialist only) & all persons holding Master's degree with 2nd division & above for Employment Assistance.
3. To prepare guidance literature for students (in connection with giving some training and direction) for competitive examinations.
4. To give important information and motivation to unemployed educated persons. Anti-Ragging Measures

IGMMV is a No Ragging Zone

Ragging in educational institutions is banned. Any one indulging in ragging will be punished appropriately which may include expulsion from the Institution, suspension from the classes or Institution for a limited period or fine with a public apology. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified, collective punishment can be awarded to act as a deterrent.

The following will be considered as acts of ragging :

Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the student to do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense or shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

There were no cases of ragging reported last year. However, students should immediately contact the Principal in the event of ragging by senior students.
